

The economic crisis that exploited during the last months of 2008 had a tremendous impact over the construction industry. Benjamín González, the owner of B&G Construction suffered it and noticed that what once was a prosperous business (residential construction) was now becoming a ghost business. From thousands of new construction projects the industry went to just a few on going projects.
